Mark 12:41-44:

“Jesus sat down opposite the place where the offerings were put and watched the crowd putting their money into the temple treasury. Many rich people threw in large amounts. But a poor widow came and put in two very small copper coins, worth only a few cents. Calling his disciples to him, Jesus said, ‘Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put more into the treasury than all the others. They all gave out of their wealth; but she, out of her poverty, put in everything—all she had to live on.’

We have discussed the lessons we can learn from this story and what it means to be generous. This story has inspired many people to acts of generosity through many generations. It teaches us to put our faith in God to meet our needs.

This half term let this story inspire us to be generous. During this pandemic many have found themselves in difficult times and the food banks are seeing an increasing demand for their services. Normally we collect produce for the food bank around harvest time but this year let us try to make it a weekly habit of buying a little extra that we can give to those in need.
