Introduction of Premier Education PE provider	£8610	1,2,3 and 4	All pupils receive good quality PE lessons that encourage a range of skills and develop confidence. Termly assessments are carried out with pupils so that programs of study can be adapted to suit need. Teacher work alongside the provider to improve their own PE delivery, which has a positive impact on all. Extras lunchtime session that are put on by our provider have allowed pupil to take part in sports such as archery and handball. Sports that would not normally be taken up. It has also helped with behaviour at lunch time. Some clubs are also put on at lunch to specifically target pupils for competitions and events.
After school multisport provided by Premier Education	Included in the above	1,3 and 4	We have developed some very good links with small schools in the area that also use Premier. This has enabled us to develop small schools competitions all year round and have some successes, such as the recent athletics competition. There is a good take up for after school clubs and as a result we are increasing the amount of clubs we can offer in 2018/19.
Subscription to NWPSSA	£400	1, 3 and 4	All pupils have access to a wide range of sports including cross country, dodgeball, cricket, Rounders and indoor athletics. PE leads have high quality CPD through the scheme and this is then used to support their professional development. As part of this subscription we had one pupil who represented the county at cross country this year.
Dance Vibe After school club	NA	1,3 and 4	This is an oversubscribed club and is very popular with all pupils. The club have been involved in school talent show and supported end of year production. Many pupils who are involved in the dance club have also signed up for dance and gymnastic clubs outside of school.

North Warwickshire Chance to shine Cricket led by Warwickshire CCC	NA	1,2,3 and 4	All year groups have been involved in many forms of Kwick Cricket over the year. Warwickshire CCC lead all sessions so pupils are coached in correct techniques of fielding and batting. Several pupils play for the local CC as a result of having taster sessions.
Water sports activities	£400	1,2,3 and 4	This has not been achieved this year. It is something that we hope to develop in the 2018-19 academic year.
New playground markings for school	£800	1 and 4	Pupils use the playground markings at all times of the day, from the minute they arrive on the playground pupils are using the track to run, number square to count and so on. Playground markings are also used to support outdoor learning and at lunchtime too.
Refurb and replace parts of existing trim trail	£2500	1 and 4	By replacing some of the trim trail it has given the pupils opportunities to use a range of skills in a safe environment in school. Many children use the trail in lunch hour under supervision and are able to climb, stretch and exercise.
Invest in new lunch time play equipment	£200	1 and 4	This has not been achieved this year. It is something that we hope to develop in the 2018-19 academic year.
