Pupil Premium Report

This report outlines how we have spent the Pupil Premium (PP) funding allocation in previous years and how we plan to spend it in this academic year.

It explains our key principles and objectives for spending the Pupil Premium in the ways we have identified.

Principles:

The Pupil Premium was introduced in April 2011, additional to main school funding. It is paid by means of a specific grant based on school census figures for pupils registered as eligible for Free School Meals at any point in the last six years. Pupil Premium is also for children who are looked after (LAC) and to pupils who have parents in the Armed Forces.

The fund is used to address the underlying inequalities between disadvantaged children and their peers, ensuring that funding reaches the pupils who need it most.

In the academic year 2015-2016 the Pupil Premium Funding will be allocated in the following ways:

Activity	Cost	Why we think it will benefit	Impact
Support staff	£7,800	Time will be allocated to support pupils on a 1:1 basis to enable us to close the identified gaps in their learning more quickly. 1:1 Nurture sessions will support pupils in overcoming their behavioural and emotional barriers to learning. In addition support staff also provide further interventions such as reading and phonics support.	
Before and after school clubs	£200	Some pupils are supported to attend before and after school clubs to build self-confidence and emotional resilience in an environment they feel comfortable in.	
Educational visits	£100	Some children are supported to attend educational school trips to broaden their life experiences.	
Educational resources to support learning	£1,500	Resources such as Numicon (breaking barriers) have been purchased in order to support further the needs of our most vulnerable learners. Also specific resources including recording equipment and an iPad to support a vulnerable child.	
Outside agencies	£440	Support of outside specialist advice e.g. Educational Psychologist , to provide ongoing advice	
Training	£220	Staff training on attachment disorders to support vulnerable children.	
Nurture	£1,000	Provision of nurture group facility to provide focused social and emotional support for children	
Uniform	£100	Provide uniform and PE kit to a vulnerable child	
Swimming	£150	1:1 support for a vulnerable child when going off site to swimming lessons	
Intervention	£800	Focused intervention groups to help children with their understanding and learning
